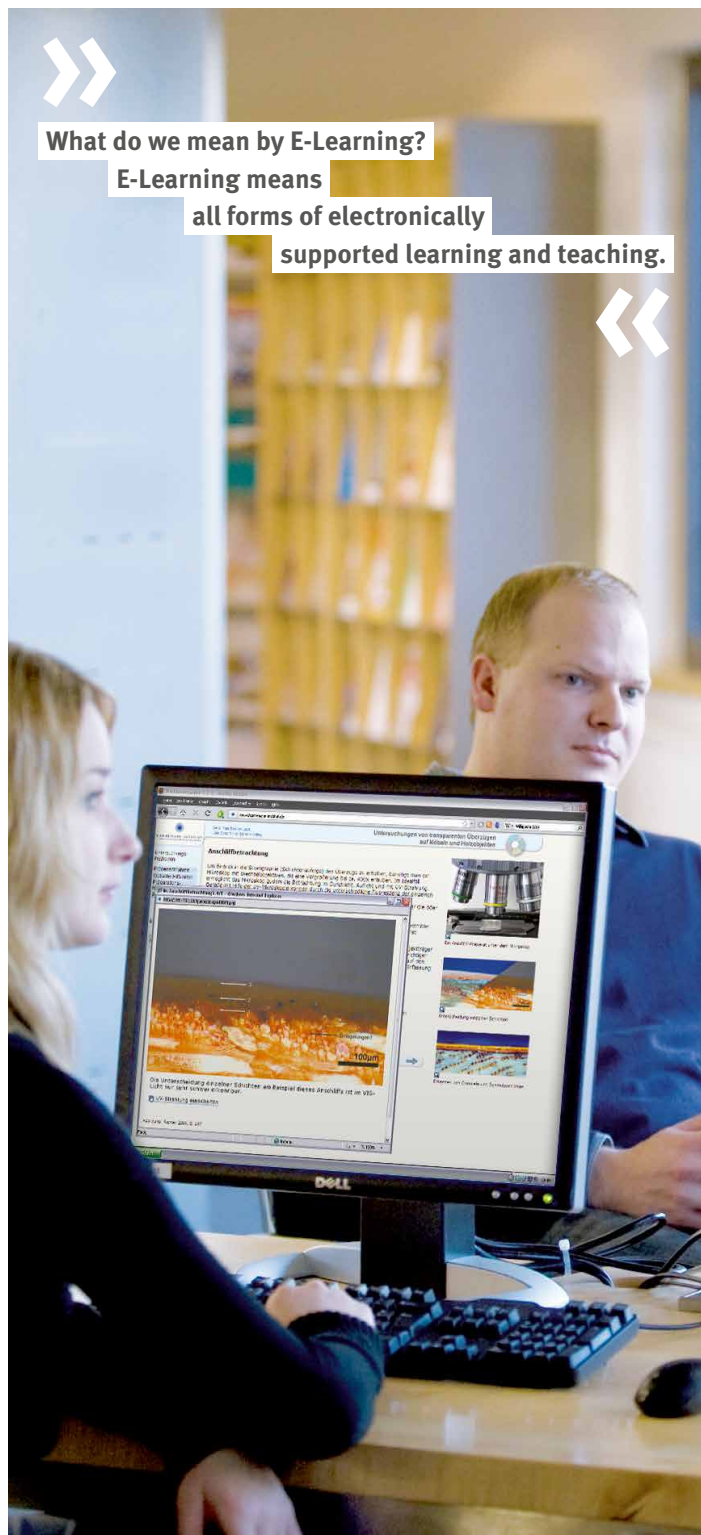


What do we mean by E-Learning?
